



# Talking Times Tables

*Two-minute phone calls, five days a week*

*We teach the times tables through daily phone calls. For each table, we help children memorise a 'sing-song chant', then we show them how to 'sing the answer' to multiplication questions. Simple, but effective!*

If you're a busy parent (like me!) here's what you'll love about our programme:

**1) Our calls are only two minutes long**

The phone rings... the call takes two minutes, the accompanying worksheet takes 30 seconds, and then you move on with your day. Short and sweet – and your child will progress every day.

**2) We work around your schedule**

Set up 5 calls per week, at times (and on phone numbers) to suit your schedule. Update these settings whenever you like.

For example, you could set up calls to "Mum's mobile" at 8am on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, and "Dad's mobile" at 4:15pm on Thursday and Friday.

**3) We like a happy home!**

The ringing phone starts the lesson – no more nagging!

Your child can answer the phone and complete the lesson by themselves. Or you can listen in, and work *with* them, rather than being the one giving the instructions or asking the questions.

**4) We know you're busy**

Our whole system is designed with busy parents in mind. Miss a call and it calls you back 3 minutes later. Miss that call and it calls at your next scheduled time - picking up where your child left off.

If you're running late and you know it, you can reschedule your call right up until the phone is due to ring!

**5) We'll run the show - but you keep control**

It's 'set and forget' - once the programme is set up, it runs itself.

Yet you still have full control over the lessons if you want to intervene. If the lessons are moving too fast, you can repeat a few. If your child is steaming ahead, you can switch to a different times table.

**6) We don't interfere with screen time**

We don't use screens - just old-fashioned phone calls and paper worksheets. So, no distractions, and no having to get your child off the screen when the lesson is over!
